The main program is built around a 7-hour hands-on curriculum for adults. It is designed so that components of the program can be used at other venues — whether it is a 10-minute business meeting, a PTA session, or a school talk for any age level. We also provide trainers with additional curriculum designed specifically for government public access TV channels, school children, church groups, school counselor in-service, and teacher in-service training.

The full parents education and prevention course covers the following:

- How computers work
- How computers connect to the Internet
- Windows basics and how to find hidden files
- Internet addressing
- E-mail issues
- Computer hacking
- Internet fraud
- Harassment and bullying
- Protecting your privacy
- Sexual predators and their methods
- Internet Chat
- Filtering and blocking unwanted sites with software
- Searching the Internet for information on you and your family
- Searching your computer to see what your child has been doing
- Internet safety summary
- When and how to report incidents to law enforcement

Attendees are also provided manuals, videos and CDs to supplement their training.

In addition to the full parent education course, trainers also learn the following:

- How to present the material in other, smaller venues and for schools
- Working with the news media to get their message out
- Setting up a community partnership to provide Internet safety education
- Managing the IYC program in their community
- What to do when a crime issue presents itself

The Internet and Your Child is a non-profit 501(c)(3) organization. After successful completion of this course, the Certified IYC Instructor will be able to obtain all future needed training materials without cost from the IYC organization for presentations in their community.

ATTENDANCE:

100% attendance is required.

Any emergencies that surface during the training program requiring student absence from class must be discussed with the onsite IYC Program Coordinator. Court appearances or other job related absences will not excuse students from class without prior arrangements with onsite staff. An unexcused absence from class will result in failure to graduate from the training.

QUALIFICATIONS

This course is open to current and retired law enforcement, Internet crime investigators, IT personnel, educators, and others interested in providing Internet crime prevention programs in their community and working with other IYC members to find solutions to emerging technology challenges and problems.

Minimum: Students should possess a basic knowledge of computers and the Internet and have experience in public speaking.

Attendees should be willing to make a long-term commitment to the program. They should be willing to provide presentations in their community in the evenings or on weekends.

COST

<u>Tuition is \$185</u>. This fee is deferred for one year following successful completion of the IYC course. In lieu of tuition, student instructors are asked for a commitment to instruct two sessions of The Internet and Your Child 7-hour parents class (local area classes) during that year. Upon completion of this commitment, the tuition is permanently waived.

Students canceling less than 72 hours prior to the start of the class will be assessed a \$90.00 registration fee. Students canceling the day of the class or "no shows" will be assessed the full \$185 tuition.
